
MISSION STATEMENT OF ST. DAVID'S UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

What is your favorite hymn? Is it one of the grand old Protestant chestnuts about God's majesty, like "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God"?

A gift from the Catholic tradition about God's tender love, like "Here I Am, Lord"? One of the sweet old-time songs of personal piety, like

"In The Garden"? Or something else?

When I got my hair cut this last time the barber and I had a conversation about church music and how it is such a shame that so many church squabbles are about what songs to sing. We concluded that it would be great if we could agree that all types of church music are important and all types of music should be a part of the church service, the most important thing needs to remain, the message from God's Word. How do the different types of church music reinforce the message that God is trying to communicate through the service? We could learn to appreciate all types of church music because it speaks to a brother or sister in faith and that is important, because they are important.

Why is it their favorite? How did they learn it? Who taught it to them? What do you feel, and what do you know about God when you sing a particular song? Our hymns are some of the most powerful ways we have of teaching the truths of God, for they both tell us our faith and make us feel it as well. Try singing any song of faith without having any feelings while you sing. It is impossible.

So, the next time you're faced with a crisis of faith, when you're overcome by doubt or apathy, misery or unrighteous anger, fear, or even just boredom, try

singing your favorite hymn. It won't solve every problem, but it'll be a start.

"Praise God from whom all blessings flow. Praise God, all creatures here below. Praise God above, ye heavenly host. Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost."

Flawed But Forgiven

Did you ever make a mistake so bad that you thought there was no coming back from it? The situation seemed hopeless. You may have even contemplated taking your own life.

But God offers forgiveness and hope because Jesus died to redeem us.

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:9 Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool. Isaiah 1:18

Suffering shakes our faith. The stars and the sun grow dim. Life becomes a vast mass of darkness. We lose hope. We wallow in the pain. We are paralyzed by pain and fear. We are in the pit with no hope of climbing out. No way to climb out. No one to throw us a rope. We feel like life will never get better and the pain will never go away. Our heart physically aches. We beat ourselves up over and over. We withdraw and hide. We keep our secret thoughts hidden. Because we think no one cares. No one can help us.

> I sought the LORD, and he answered me; he delivered me from all my fears. Those who look to Him are radiant; their faces are not covered with shame. Psalm 34:4-5

We have lost control. We never were never really in control to begin with, but we thought we were. God is the only one in control of the universe and our own personal little piece of it. But we lost something – our self-control, our motivation, our self-esteem, our joy, our hope because of something we did or something that was done to us.

> You are my hiding place; you will protect me from trouble and surround me with songs of deliverance. I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my loving eye on you. Psalm 32:7-8

The battle in our minds is from Satan. But we have the power, through Jesus, to DEMOLISH strongholds. Demolish is a strong word. We don't have to let Satan win. We can't fight him alone. We need Jesus' power to take back our minds. Take back our lives.

> It is God who arms me with strength and keeps my way secure. Psalm 18:32

We don't have to receive and believe any thoughts Satan puts into our heads. They are always lies. Satan is a liar and a deceiver from the word go. Make a point to know God's Word, meditate on God's Word so when Satan comes to try and destroy, you are prepared for battle with God and his angel armies.

> God of Angel Armies, who is like you, powerful and faithful **from every angle?** You put the arrogant ocean in its place and calm its waves when they turn unruly. Psalm 89:8

What you feed grows. What you starve dies. What are you feeding your mind with? Satan's lies or God's Word? We don't have to believe Satan's lies about ourselves. We can renew our minds with God's Truth moment by moment. Believe what God says about you, not what Satan is telling you. God loves you. He has a plan and purpose for your life. You are not worthless. You are holy, righteous, and redeemed.

> Do not conform to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Romans 12:2

There's a war going on in your mind. Satan is trying to claim it. But Jesus already won the war.

Satan will use people to confuse and control your mind.

Satan builds a stronghold in our minds. A stronghold is anything that has a strong hold on us. Bitterness, self-doubt, fear, condemnation, anxiety, feelings of worthlessness.

But we have the power, divine power, to DEMOLISH strongholds.

For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. 2 Corinthians 10:3-4

Friends, I've been to the pit of destruction, depression, despair and back. No one threw me a rope, but I had an anchor. Through the pain. Through the tears. Through the desperation. I had Jesus. In agony, I cried out to God, and He heard me. I had to reach the end of myself. I had to lose all hope in people. I had been betrayed by a friend and felt I couldn't trust anyone again. Some things we must go through alone on a personal level, and no one person or people can help us. It is a journey between ourselves and God only. When God sees that you remain faithful to Him and His Word through the tears, through the heartache, through the loss, through the feelings of worthlessness and the hopelessness, He will send you a lifeline. Maybe not a big one at first to rescue you completely because He wants you to rely on your faith, not on people, but little by little, He will help your heart to heal and send new people and faithful friends into your life to provide that lifeline.

> I waited patiently for the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry. He drew me up from the pit of destruction, out of the miry bog, and set me feet upon a rock, making my steps secure. Psalm 40:1-2 ESV

Whatever you're going through, don't give up. Help is on the way. Don't lose hope. Healing will come. Life as you knew it may never be the same, but if you stick with God, He will take your pain and turn it into something beautiful. He will give you double for your trouble. He is always watching over you even when you can't feel His presence. When you can't even pray because you're in so much pain, that's when the Holy Spirit steps in and does our praying for us. The Holy Spirit is our direct line to God, and when there is no other lifeline available that is visible to us, the Holy Spirit is always there.

> In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. Romans 8:26-27

Stop trying to make things happen on your own. Stop trying to manipulate the situation to work out for you. God may be closing a door or a chapter on your life because He has so much more in store for you. Even in the loss, God is there. You can't get your loved one back, but God can still take your ashes and turn them to beauty. Maybe through the loss, new doors will open. God is still using you, even if it's just to comfort people who have experienced the same thing.

> ...to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. Isaiah 61:3

Jesus needs to be at the helm. Ask Him to lead you. He will guide you through the storms. And when the pain is so overwhelming that you can't speak the words to ask God for help, the Holy Spirit will intercede for us. Even in the darkest night, the deepest pit, hang on, because help is on the way. Peace will replace your anxiety. Healing will ease your pain. New opportunities will arise no matter how hopeless it seems right now. Be faithful in the storm, and God will be there for you and bless you. He offers forgiveness no matter what we have done. Repent and give your life to Him, and He will guide your steps.

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; In all your ways, acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths. Proverbs 3:5-6 See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called the children of God! And that is what we are! 1 John 3:1 The name of Jesus is power. He can break every chain. Break every stronghold. And from the ashes of despair come beauty beyond anything we could have ever imagined if we only hold on to Him when our world is crashing down around us. Hold on to your Anchor. Hold on to your Lifeline. He will not let you down if you remain faithful and hold on to Him. It may take a while to work through the pain, but on the other side of pain is hope. On the other side of pain, are good things waiting for you.

> For I know the plans I have for you, "declares the Lord," plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future. Jeremiah 29:11

Heavenly Father, Thank you for Your love. Thank you for your Son, through Him there is mighty power that He gives to us. Through him there is forgiveness. Please Lord, help those who are hurting today. Give them strength to hold on with You as their anchor. Let them know they are loved and valued and special in Your eyes. In Jesus name. Amen.



This non-profit organization works in the USA and abroad to free victims of human trafficking, assist with their aftercare and develop relationships with law enforcement to offer resources for criminal investigations:

In 2023 they were involved in 4000 operations, and 6500 arrests. They have impacted over 7000 lives.

They have added a K-9 program that helps to locate USB devices on the criminals that store child sexual abuse materials. The K-9 dogs can identify a unique chemical used on USB drives. This is helpful in prosecuting them.

There are millions of people trafficked worldwide. Trafficking includes, but is not limited to, using people for forced labor, sexual exploitation and organ harvesting. Traffickers see the unsettled situations, such as the displacement of people during war in the Ukraine as an opportunity for exploitation.

O.U.R. provides "Aftercare" to equip the survivors with safe accommodations. They give personalized care and offer life skills to reduce the victim's vulnerability and restore their dignity.

The Stolte Scholarship Fund was established in 1973 in memory of Rev. Robert H. Stolte. The fund provides a one-time grant of \$1000 to an individual in the greater Hanover area pursuing a career in the field of ministry, missions, or humanitarian service. The administration of the fund is handled by the Hanover Area Council of Churches.

The applicant must submit an application form and submit a brief summary of their call into the field and their future vocational goals. They should be an active member of a church, with good moral character and high scholastic ability.
