## Psalm 96

#### Matthew 22:15-22

Paying the Imperial Tax to Caesar

- <sup>15</sup> Then the Pharisees went out and laid plans to trap him in his words. <sup>16</sup> They sent their disciples to him along with the Herodians. "Teacher," they said, "we know that you are a man of integrity and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. You aren't swayed by others, because you pay no attention to who they are. <sup>17</sup> Tell us then, what is your opinion? Is it right to pay the imperial tax to Caesar or not?"
- <sup>18</sup> But Jesus, knowing their evil intent, said, "You hypocrites, why are you trying to trap me? <sup>19</sup> Show me the coin used for paying the tax." They brought him a denarius, <sup>20</sup> and he asked them, "Whose image is this? And whose inscription?"
- <sup>21</sup> "Caesar's," they replied. Then he said to them, "So give back to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's."
- <sup>22</sup> When they heard this, they were amazed. So, they left him and went away.

## **HYMN NOTES:**

## BREATHE ON ME BREATH OF GOD: Edwin Hatch, 1835–1889

Edwin Hatch, D.D., was born at Derby, Sep. 4, 1835, and educated at Pembroke College, Oxford, B.A., in honors, in 1857. After holding important appointments in Canada, he returned to England and became Vice-Principal of St. Mary Hall, Oxford, 1867; and Rector of Purleigh, 1883. He died November 10, 1889. His hymn-writing was limited—just one, and that a very spirited lyric, is in Allon's Congregational Psalmist Hymnal, 1886 "Breathe On Me, Breath of God." (Whitsuntide.) A collection of Dr. Hatch's sacred poems was published posthumously in a little book called "Towards Fields of Light," London 1890. The book is a little collection of poems written by Hatch and collected at various times by his wife. The book is free to view and/or download online (search "Towards Fields of Light," Edwin Hatch).

GOD, WHOSE GIVING KNOWS NO ENDING: Written by Robert L. Edwards (1961). This text on stewardship was one of about 450 submissions in a search for such hymns conducted by the Hymn Society of America in 1961. These words are well-grounded by their musical setting, an early American shape note tune named for a Baptist church in Harris County, Georgia, "Beach Spring."
